Happy Holidays! I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving. I am always amazed at how quickly the time flies between Thanksgiving and our winter break. We have many exciting things on our calendar. As you are aware, our fifth grade winter concert will be taking place on Tuesday, Dec. 13. On Monday, Dec. 19, the fourth graders will be performing their winter concert. Both shows will be at 7 p.m. at the High School.

This year we implemented a daily 15-minute sustained-silent reading program in all classrooms. During this time, students read books that are at their independent reading levels. We have also been using Accelerated Reader (Mind Joggers) more extensively this school year. In addition to students being able to earn a spot in the "point clubs," we have also created school-wide and individual reading incentives. Mrs. Wagner, our art teacher, has made a wonderful dragon outside the Linntown office. When students pass an AR test that is at their instructional reading level, they may add a scale to the dragon. Once the dragon reaches various points in the hallway, the students will receive an award. For our first reward, we will be taking all Linntown students to the Campus Theatre on Wednesday, Dec. 21. Permission slips and additional details will be coming home in the very near future.

Although the temperatures have been relatively mild for this time of year, colder weather is definitely on its way. Please make sure that your child has the proper attire for going out to recess. Students should have a winter coat, as well as gloves/mittens and some type of head covering. We received a large selection of gently used coats during our coat drive. ## VISION 2020 Forum Review **Mark DiRocco, Superintendent**

Approximately 45 people attended the VISION 2020 Forum on Nov. 9 at Lewisburg Area High School. The purpose of the meeting was to review the district's progress in meeting the goals and objectives of VISION 2020 and discuss the new fiscal reality that may impact our future. In 2007, the Lewisburg Area School District established an ambitious plan to create a true learning community and a 21st Century School District called VISION 2020. In cooperation with many school stakeholders, we developed a 13-year time frame to create a preferred future for our children.

VISION 2020 was written before the economy began to falter in 2008, and we now find ourselves in a very difficult budget situation as we face significant cuts in funding from the state and federal government. Consequently, we are facing a new fiscal reality that will challenge our ability to continue with our VISION 2020 Plan.

Those present at the Forum helped us review our progress to date with our strategic plan and provided comments and feedback to help us with our future direction. The VISION 2020 Strategic Plan has eight overarching goals and 35 objectives. We asked participants to select what they considered to be the three most important objectives of the eight. They chose the following:

**Goal I: Establish an appropriate, rigorous, authentic curriculum for each student.**

**Goal II: Expand the implementation of differentiated instruction based on individual student interests, abilities and needs.**

**Goal III: Make creativity and the acquisition of problem-solving skills an essential part of the curriculum.**

It is not surprising that the goals most directly related to teaching and learning were selected as the highest priority. The greater Lewisburg community has always valued education and placed a high importance on quality instruction for our children. It was heartening to see this priority rise to the top as the evening unfolded.

We also asked the participants to complete an exercise where they gave a positive or negative rating to a list of programs and activities that are currently sponsored by the district that potentially could be changed, reduced or cut due to financial budget constraints. The list of activities was representative and not intended to be inclusive of all we do across the district or limited in regard to future budget discussions. We learned that the items the participants valued the most were small class sizes at the elementary schools; music, art and physical education classes for all students; middle school and high school



band and chorus; the fall play and spring musical; high school electives, and AP courses. Some items that were viewed with lower priority were interactive whiteboards in the classrooms, the number of middle school and high school sports offered, and field trips for students.

The Forum also provided the participants with an opportunity to list specific comments regarding the goals and objectives of the VISION 2020 Plan and share their thoughts on what else we should add to the plan to improve our educational program across the district.
